You will be collected from your accommodation in the morning before you embark on a day out exploring the wild landscape of North Pembrokeshire.

St Davids

St Davids is named after the patron saint of Wales, Saint David. St Davids is the smallest city in Britain with a population of just over 1,600. It has been a place of pilgrimage for centuries and is home to the breath-taking 12th century St Davids Cathedral.



St Justinians Bay

We take a short drive to St Justinians Bay to experience the spectacular views from the Pembrokeshire Coastal path. This is a great opportunity to spot for porpoise and dolphins as well as sea birds. St Justinians has 3 lifeboat stations and a 6th Century chapel.



Whitesands

St Davids Peninsula has some of the most magnificent coastal scenery in Pembrokeshire. This is the heart of The Pembrokeshire Coast National Park and with a stunning blue flag beach this sight is one of the best, enjoyed from a little stroll along the coastal path.



Lunch

We can either make a stop for lunch at the Mill Café or take a picnic lunch with us to enjoy on the coastal path in Whitesands.

Melin Tregwynt Woollen Mill

There has been a mill on this site since the 17th century, when local farmers would bring their fleeces to be spun into yarn and woven into sturdy Welsh wool blankets. Owned by the same family since 1912 the Mill now employs over 30 people and makes things that are useful, beautiful to look at and just a little bit special.



Strumble Head Lighthouse

Strumble Head Lighthouse is perched on a tiny island just off the coast and reached by a small suspension bridge. The Lighthouse is automated so there is no access to the island. The views of the coast are dramatic, and the sea is rich with marine life, keep your eyes peeled for bottlenose dolphins and porpoise that visit the area!



Pentre Ifan

One of Wales' most visited megalithic cromlechs, dating back some five thousand years. This fine burial chamber has an impressive 20-toncapstone, which makes you wonder how this blue dolerite ever came to rest here!
